The Meaning and Importance of Election

"For the children being not yet born, neither having done any good or evil, that the purpose of God according to election might stand, not of works, but of him that calleth; It was said unto her, The elder shall serve the younger. As it is written, Jacob have I loved, but Esau have I hated." Romans 9:11-13

Election is an essential component in everyone's life. It is a manifestation of the will. Without election, a person has no will. Everyone wants choice/selection/ election. You find it in your interest in your future, wanting to decide for yourself what you will do with your life. Most of you prefer selecting your own spouse rather than arranged marriages, for example.

God's election is essential, for it destroys pride and any sense of earning or deserving a relationship with God. Without election you cannot have biblical grace. The doctrine of imputation assumes you have no intrinsic worth. Your will is an essential part of you, but no man exercises his will in favor of God.¹

People reject the biblical teaching on election because it destroys man's sense of being in control. Man is addicted to autonomy and autonomy necessitates control. People wish to earn their way to heaven by works, or believe that all people go to heaven, which is an eternal form of egalitarianism.

At times this is too painful to think about. Election produces fear – what if you do not like the result? However, the absence of election produces fatalism – if you cannot do anything about it, you become passive. At times this is too painful to think about. For this reason, God balances election with human choice, even though the two are mutually exclusive; God wants you to know that He is in control, but you can decide.

Only God is in Control. If He does not elect, He cannot exercise His will. He becomes some mechanical Force. Like you, God has favorites, and will continue having them forever.
