must avoid two things: First, don't become the slave of authority. You are solely the slave of God. Observe, inquire, and form opinions, but remember that you belong to Christ. Second, don't despise your authority or rebel against the "system;" it is God-ordained. "There is no power but of God. The powers that be are ordained by God."

Wardlaw said, "The weak reed, by bending in a rough wind receives no hurt, while the sturdy oak is torn up by its roots." When authority is brash and unreasonable, don't resist it. Keep your mouth closed and God will quiet him down. "The Lord shall fight for you and you shall hold your peace." Solomon continues by suggesting that a wise person maintains objectivity and observes what is happening. It is objectivity and observes what is happening.
