From my experience, those numbers are very accurate. This is a tragedy! I pray that this letter will encourage you that in all of our huddles and one-on-one discipleship studies, the gospel is preached, the bible is taught and living in obedience to Christ and being unashamed of Him is expected for those who profess His name. This Fall semester, we will host a college group in our home for deeper study and discipleship and we will also have a campus Huddle that will be more evangelistic and apologetic in nature. 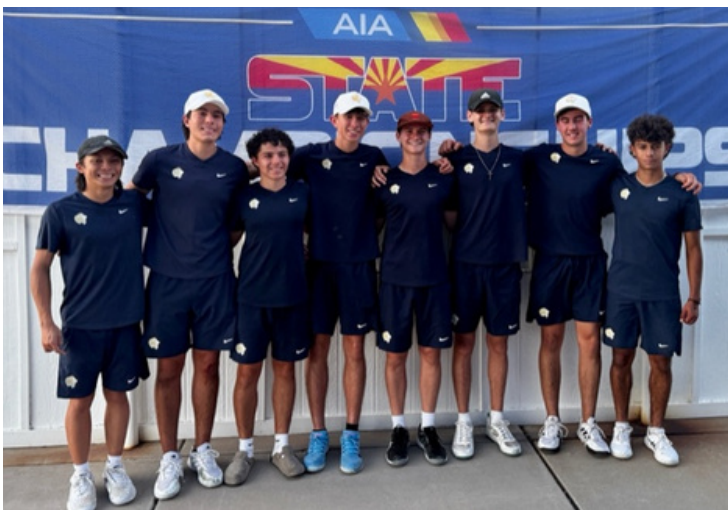


PRCA Tennis and New Huddle
